# **Case Distribution Requirements**

Total Required Cases: 120

First Scrub Role: Minimum of 80 casesSecond Scrub Role: Maximum of 40 cases

• Observation Role: Documented but not counted toward the 120 required cases

# **General Surgery**

Minimum Total Cases: 30 cases
First Scrub Role: At least 20 cases
Second Scrub Role: Up to 10 cases

# **Surgical Specialties**

• Minimum Total Cases: 90 cases

• First Scrub Role: At least 60 cases o Must be distributed across at least 5 diLerent specialties o Maximum of 15 cases per specialty

• Second Scrub Role: Up to 30 cases

## **Role Definitions**

### First Scrub Role Student

#### must:

- Verify supplies and equipment
- Set up sterile field
- Perform operative counts
- Pass instruments and supplies
- Maintain sterile technique

## Second Scrub Role Student

#### may:

- Assist with suctioning, retracting, sponging
- Cut sutures
- Provide camera assistance
- Participate in diagnostic endoscopy or vaginal delivery

#### **Observation Role**

Student observes the procedure without meeting criteria for First or Second Scrub roles. These cases must be documented but do not count toward the 120-case requirement.



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### **Clinical Experience Assignment Policy**

The Surgical Technology Program assigns clinical rotations based on educational priorities, not geographic convenience. The program primarily utilizes Loma Linda University Health facilities, including Loma Linda University Medical Center, Loma Linda University Children's Hospital, Loma Linda University Surgical Hospital, Loma Linda University East Campus Hospital, Loma Linda University Health Outpatient Surgical Center, and Loma Linda University Medical Center – Murrieta. Additional facilities, outside of Loma Linda University Health, within a 60-mile radius of Loma Linda University campus may also be utilized. Students should expect to rotate through multiple facilities which may not be the closest to their residence. Clinical assignments are made to ensure students meet graduation requirements outlined in the AST 7th Edition Core Curriculum.

Students must provide their own reliable transportation and assume responsibility for travelrelated risks. Clinical experiences may occur during evenings, weekends, or daytime hours to ensure exposure to a comprehensive range of surgical cases. The program has no control over location of clinical sites in relation to student residency location and placement decisions are made to maximize educational outcomes and case variety.
