Technical Standards for Surgical Technology Program and Profession

To successfully complete the Surgical Technology A.S. Degree and enter the profession, students must meet the following minimum technical standards:

Physical Abilities

Students must be able to:

- Stand continuously for up to 6 hours and remain alert.
- Lift and carry at least 25 pounds; assist in patient positioning and transfers.
- Bend, stretch, twist, and reach with arms and body.
- Demonstrate fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination for manipulating instruments.
- Wear and tolerate PPE (e.g., masks, gloves, lead aprons) for extended periods.
- Move and manipulate surgical equipment and furniture (e.g., OR tables, carts).

Sensory Abilities

Students must possess:

- Visual acuity to observe the sterile field, instruments, and patient conditions.
- Auditory perception to hear verbal instructions, alarms, and equipment signals.
- Tactile ability to detect temperature, surface characteristics, and anatomical variances.
- Olfactory ability to detect unusual or hazardous odors.

Communication Skills

Students must be able to:

- Communicate effectively in English (spoken, written, and non-verbal).
- Interact respectfully and professionally with patients, peers, and healthcare teams.

- Discuss procedures and respond appropriately in high-pressure situations.
- Use information technology for documentation and communication.

Cognitive and Emotional Competencies

Students must demonstrate:

- Critical thinking and problem-solving skills in surgical contexts.
- Ability to synthesize and apply classroom knowledge in clinical settings.
- Emotional stability and adaptability to stressful environments.
- Professional judgment and decision-making under pressure.

Safety and Infection Control

Students must:

- Adhere to safety protocols and aseptic techniques.
- Recognize and respond to hazardous conditions.
- Maintain immunization and health requirements.
- Operate equipment safely and follow emergency procedures.

Professionalism and Interpersonal Skills

Students must:

- Exhibit integrity, ethical behavior, and concern for others.
- Respect diversity in culture, religion, orientation, and ability.
- Demonstrate teamwork, impulse control, and maturity.
- Maintain appropriate boundaries and professional rapport.

Accommodations

Students must meet these standards with or without reasonable accommodations.
